Christopher Lash, #846, on oath says that, to best of affiant's knowledge and belief that James Edward Hardee did, in the County aforesaid, commit the offense of, 16-5-23 (a) (1) SIMPLE BATTERY from 8:06 PM on 10/11/2022 to 10:45 PM on 10/11/2022, in Morgan County, Georgia; the Place of occurrence of said offense being 1280 Broughton Trail Newborn, Georgia 30056; and against the laws of the State of Georgia.


Said offense being described as O.C.G.A. 16-5-23 (a) (1) SIMPLE BATTERY.

The affiant has probable cause to believe that the accused did commit the offense of SIMPLE BATTERY when he or she either intentionally makes physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with the person of another. TO WIT: In response to a subject refusing to leave call, the victim returned to his residence after a six month good behavior bond which removed him from the property. Upon returning to the property which is shared with the defendant's ex-wife, she contacted the defendant to come to the residence. When the defendant arrived, he told the victim to leave the residence and was wielding a fishing rod in a manner to intimidate the victim. When the victim didn't leave, the defendant struck the victim in the chest as observed by watching a cell phone video taken by the victim. The victim also had a bruise on his chest from this incident upon my arrival.

On Tuesday, October 11, 2022 at approximately 8:24 p.m., I, Sergeant Lash, responded to 1280 Broughton Trail, Newborn, Georgia in reference to a subject refusing to leave call.

Upon my arrival, I was met by Ms. Janet Hardee, Ms. Jordan Hardee, and Ms. Claire Hardee. Jordan was in tears stating she was in fear and that a man, later identified to be Mr. Derrick Williamson, had been screaming, verbally abusive and threatening to hit her. I asked what had led up to this encounter and was informed that Derrick had lived in the house until a good behavior bond was signed on April 7, 2022 forcing Derrick to vacate the premises for six months while a court case was in process. Janet provided a copy of the good behavior bond which expired approximately four days prior to my arrival. On this date, Derrick returned to the residence and walked right into the house while the Hardee`s were there. Janet is a resident in the house and prior business partner with Derrick when the property was purchased to be used as an animal rescue. According to Janet, she supplied nearly one million dollars to start the animal rescue and Derrick had convinced her the assets should be purchased by his company, The Way Dynamic Animal Therapy Encounters. The business fell apart along with the relationship between Janet and Derrick, even though both parties remained residents at this address. Janet stated that due to the good behavior bond, Derrick had no longer been a resident for the past six months and should have to leave the property. After getting the initial information, I proceeded into the residence to speak with Derrick.

Derrick stated that he is the owner of the property as it was deeded to his company. Derrick stated he was wrongfully forced to vacate the residence as a result of a good behavior bond issued in the Morgan County Magistrate Court, but that it had expired allowing him to return to the residence. Derrick stated when he returned to the residence, he began filming as he walked through the property to assess any damages or missing items when the Hardee`s contacted Janet`s ex-husband, Mr. James Hardee. Derrick stated that once James arrived on scene, he was attacked multiple times. Derrick stated James shoved him to the ground near a back door into a white board, threatened him with a fishing pole, and even punched him in the chest. Derrick showed me bruises on his chest and left arm. Derrick stated he had videos I could observe, and I asked him to play the videos. In one video I observed Derrick was on the floor with his legs in front of him with James standing over him screaming at him. In another video taken while Derrick was sitting on the couch in the living room, James was observed entering through the front door with a white fishing pole taunting Derrick. James could be seen striking the couch very close to where Derrick was sitting while yelling at Derrick to leave the residence. As James instructed Derrick to leave the residence, he made a comment that Derrick would "need an Uber", causing Derrick to believe James may have damaged his 2007 GMC Sierra, (Georgia registration XGH001) as he would have the knowledge to do so. In another video, James could be seen performing a punching/pushing maneuver towards the camera, striking Derrick.

At this time Derrick showed me a video he had taken of Jordan. This video was very lengthy and showed that Jordan had been the aggressor in the incident between the two of them. Jordan was observed following Derrick through the house attempting to provoke him into physical confrontation multiple times. I observed through the video that Derrick had reclaimed his bedroom and Jordan had forced her way in, taking a seat on his bed while still attempting to provoke Derrick. Derrick stated that he had recently lost someone very close to him in a motorcycle accident and that in an attempt to provoke him, Jordan began using the name of that subject to goad Derrick. This is when Derrick began to yell at Jordan stating not to use that name, but never moved towards Jordan in any visible manner. Derrick instead appeared to be trying to get away from Jordan, but she followed him constantly provoking him while telling him to leave. At one point Jordan was observed shoving Derrick in a hallway screaming at him to hit her. Derrick was observed trying to rush back into the bedroom and shut the door, but Jordan crashed through the door where her face was visible in the doorway still screaming at him. These actions were inconsistent with her

earlier statements and appeared to be the aggressor throughout the video that was approximately ten minutes long or more. Derrick advised he wanted to press charges against James and Jordan.

I returned to the living room and asked Jordan to step outside with me. I asked Jordan about observations I made watching the video, and she did not provide me any information to indicate she was actually provoked into such behavior. I informed Jordan of my observations throughout the video and that I felt I had enough to charge her with disorderly conduct. At this point I needed to speak with Janet again, but before I did I called Judge Holt to see if I could get some clarification as to the civil side of this on-going incident to see if I had any legal authority to remove one party or the other. After speaking with Judge Holt, it was confirmed that there were civil cases still unresolved in regards to ownership and residency. I was also told I would not be able to charge Jordan with disorderly conduct at this time, but could proceed with simple assault charges against James due to observing him strike Derrick in the video. (The more applicable charge would be simple battery.) I spoke with Janet outside of the residence who stated she had spent over one million dollars to get the animal rescue business going, and that it was all done through Derrick's company. I informed Janet I would not be able to force either party to leave the residence as Derrick is still the legal owner and resident, and she is also a legal resident of the property. Janet was advised to contact her lawyer in reference to her pending civil case.

I asked Derrick if he would be willing to leave for the night, and he stated he would not. I also advised Derrick I could not remove either party due to the ownership and residency issues. I advised Derrick to contact his lawyer as well in reference to the outstanding civil cases. Both parties were advised to remain separated for the evening. Jordan became very vocal towards me stating she would continue to call 911 if Derrick was not removed so I advised her I had no legal authority to do so at this time and would seek abuse of 911 if she followed through. Jordan then decided to take her baby and leave the residence. Janet decided she would take Claire and her mother-in-law somewhere else for the night and began to make arrangements to stay somewhere else. Derrick and I went outside to check to make sure his truck was not damaged. Derrick was able to start and move the vehicle elsewhere on the property, out of the way of the other vehicles parked there. There was a very small oil leak Derrick and I were not able to find the source of, but the dipstick in the engine bay still showed the oil was full. Derrick also advised he recently had the oil changed approximately two weeks ago. I observed a small swipe of motor oil on the outside of the front driver side tire. Unfortunately at this time, I am unable to determine the source of the oil leak or swipe on the tire. Derrick requested this be documented in the event something happens with his vehicle later.

Both parties were handed contact cards with this case number written on them. I will pursue charges through the Magistrate Court next date for one count of disorderly conduct against Jordan, and one count of simple battery against James. Both parties were once again advised to stay separated and not to damage one another's property. Janet, Claire and Janet's mother-in-law did eventually leave the residence for the night after a second call to our dispatch center was received, prior to my return to the residence.
